MI. 3:1

See, I will send my messenger and he will prepare the way before Me. Then suddenly the Lord you are seeking will come to his temple; the Messenger of the Covenant, whom you desire is coming."

* * * * * * * * * * * * * * * *

How many messengers are there in this text of Scripture? Do you see two? Ok, I kind of gave it away by capitalizing one and not the other. There are two and this is a text that refers to the very beginning of Jesus' ministry when John the Baptist (messenger 1) begins to cry out in the desert places of Israel that the Messiah (Messenger 2) is coming. We know this because Mark at the start of his Gospel quotes a portion of this text combining it with the classic text of Isaiah 40:3 – "Prepare the way of the Lord!" By the way the name Malachi means "my messenger." So I suppose we can even say there are three messengers here if we include the prophet as well.

I want to point out once again that this word "messenger" is also the word used for "angel." It can be translated either way. The translators here have chosen to render it this way because, in the first case, it obviously refers to a human messenger, John the Baptist. In many other instances where it points to a supernatural being, it is translated "angel." But, we have argued that in many of those instances where the Angel of Jehovah appears, we are not looking at a created supernatural messenger from God, but the uncreated Messenger/Word of God – Jesus Himself. That is Who we have here in our second use of this word. He is called the Messenger of the Covenant and He is equated with the Lord Who will suddenly appear in His temple. You will recall that John the apostle tells us that one of the first things Jesus did at the beginning of His ministry was to suddenly appear in the temple and overturn the tables of the moneychangers (Jn. 2:13-22).



Notice that the prophet Malachi says that this Messenger of the Covenant is desired, sought after, by the people of Israel. Indeed, wherever He appears in the Old Testament it signals something big from God is about to happen. This was especially true in Jesus' day when the expectation of the coming of Messiah was at its peak. So why was He missed by many? Human desires often deceive when we allow our ideas to get in the way of what God is actually doing. That is why it is so important that we follow Jesus and not get out in front of Him!

Here we are at the end of the Old Testament. When we began our journey looking for Jesus in the Scripture, we started in Genesis at the very beginning. A week or so ago we read in our Gospel text (Lk. 24:44-45) that Jesus opened the minds of His disciples to understand what all the Scriptures (the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms) said about Him. This threefold division is how the Jews even to this day speak of their entire Bible (our Old Testament). I hope you have been able in this journey to follow the footsteps of Jesus in the Old Testament. Malachi is the perfect prophet to end with as he sums up all the desire and hope that will burst on the scene in Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, where we will hear Jesus say to His disciples, to us, "Follow Me!"

FROM THE BOARD OF DEACONS...

Please be with us to share these important days with the families as these children are baptized into the Body of Christ, "sealed with the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever".

Our new **Bible study** group is about to be off and running. The study is entitled "Who I am in Christ", and begins May 7. The group decision was to meet every two weeks on Tuesday evenings at 6:30 PM. This is a joint study with Vangen, meetings will be held at Vangen which is centrally located for those attending. If anyone missed the initial meeting and would like to join the group, please contact Vicar Brent who will have extra copies of the study outline.

Did you know that **Ascension Day** is one of the festivals of the Church, even though we normally do not have a worship service on that day, possibly in part because it always falls on a Thursday! The church marks Ascension Day 40 days after Easter, so, like Easter, the date varies from year to year. This year on May 9, pause and remember Christ's ascension into heaven!

Ascension Day is followed 10 days later by **Pentecost** (pente meaning 50, it is 50 days after Easter.) This was the day of wind and fire! We read in the second chapter of Acts that the disciples were gathered together when there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, tongues of fire rested on them, and they were filled with the Holy Spirit. Recently Vicar Brent pointed out that the Pascal candle (or Christ candle) is lit every Sunday morning through the Easter season to remind us that during that time Jesus Christ was physically present in the world. But starting on Pentecost, the Christ candle is no longer lit because now the Holy Spirit is present within and among us out in the world.


